What Does It Mean to Serve Together?

Looking carefully as you walk around the Mill-Green buildings you will see different size posters which share the message, "*Live Like Jesus SERVE One Another*". The posters have been placed in the churches to remind us of God's calling upon our lives. They are intended to stimulate the hearts and minds of all who are presently in the church as well as those who will participate in the church in the days and weeks to come. They communicate the message that we are people of humility who desire to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the world.



The word "serve" is defined as follows: First, it can mean to perform duties or services for (another person or an organization), and secondly it


can mean to present (food or drink) to someone. As followers of Jesus we are called to emulate His life as found outlined in the pages of scripture. Jesus' entire life was one of service! He prayed for others, healed the sick, provided sight to the blind, cast out evil spirits, fed the hungry, preached good news to many people, as well as many other acts. Yet Jesus' most significant act of service to humankind is found in His death on the Cross to pay for the sin of all people. Jesus is the prime example of service to others, and as His church it is imperative that we serve God by serving together as His hands and feet.

Paul tells the church in Ephesus, "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Eph 2:10). God created all people with a desire to reflect His goodness and serve Him by caring for all people. This is not simply a natural act (i.e. food, clothing, shelter), but a spiritual endeavor that shows people the goodness and love of God by being His hands and feet. It is through us that people have their physical needs met as well as the opportunity to hear the good news of the gospel and have their spiritual needs meet as well.

Serving together is God's call upon our lives. The church is a family that is brought together under the banner of the Cross to make a difference for the kingdom of God. We are called to take time out of our busy lives and schedules and create opportunities for God to use us to help others. We are called to help others see the benefits of His work on the Cross and to embrace Jesus Christ as the way to heaven.

As we walk through the upcoming months let's live like Jesus and serve one another, and as we do we need to be sure to serve God together. We are all gifted differently and we all are called to share our unique gifts, but we do so as the church of Jesus Christ! What does it mean to serve together? It means we follow the mandates of the Gospel and serve like Jesus served as a faithful body of believers who have lived the Old Testament command, "⁵ Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength". Duet 6:5.

BIBLE STUDY



QUAKER QUILTERS



A Message from the Bishop

Bishop Jeremiah J. Park *"I pray they will be one....They can be one just as we are one... ...they will be made perfectly one...." (John 17:21-23, CEB)*



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ of the Susquehanna Annual Conference,

Grace to you in the name of Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace, Healer of our Brokenness and Hope of the World! The Judicial Council is meeting this week to address several critical matters that have been forwarded for their decision. As part of their deliberation the Judicial Council will act on a request for a declaratory decision from the South Central Jurisdiction on the Western Jurisdiction's election of the Rev. Karen Oliveto, a married lesbian, as a Bishop of the United Methodist Church. I realize that, as people of faith with love for Christ and the church, many of us are deeply concerned and anxious about the decision to be made by the Judicial Council. I, too, am deeply concerned and feel the anxiousness of the church.


I urge you to pray for God's Spirit to hover over the meeting of the Judicial Council. Please pray for the members of the Council and the individuals, families, congregations, and annual conferences that are directly connected to this case, as well as the whole church. Just as God's Spirit hovered over the waters of creation, so I believe God's Spirit will continue to breathe life into the church.

As we anticipate the Judicial Council's ruling I want to remind us of our church polity. Only the General Conference can speak for the church. No matter what decision is offered by the Judicial Council, the 2016 Book of Discipline remains as it is. Each decision will be very specific to one circumstance. Together we are more than any one action or any one decision. Let us not be so quick to act and decide that we fail to allow God's Holy Spirit to bring light, understanding, healing and hope to God's beloved Church.

The Council of Bishops has now called for a Special Session of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church to be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri. The special session is limited to receiving and acting on a report from the Council of Bishops based on the recommendations of the Commission on A Way Forward. I urge the congregations and clergy of our beloved conference to pray for God's Spirit to continue to work in and through the Commission. As the General Conference mandated the task of the Commission, our church deserves the best chance for a way forward.

Our prayers for and commitment to the unity of the church must be intensified for such a time as this. Out of my deep gratitude for the genuine, loving spirit and faithfulness of the congregations and clergy of the Susquehanna Conference, I solicit your fervent prayers for this moment and for the leading of God's Spirit for our beloved church. God has always been faithful in the past, and we have all the confidence that God's faithfulness will remain stead-fast.


Make this craft to display a bit of springtime year-round!

- Q-tips
- Paper towels

What you do:

- 1. Roll up one sleeve and paint your arm and the palm of your hand brown.
- 2. Lengthwise on the paper, carefully place your painted arm and hand, with fingers spread apart. (This is the tree trunk and branches.)
- 3. Place the other paint colors on the plate.
- 4. Using Q-tips, place dots of paint (blossoms!) all over the branches.
